Our curriculum 16 to 18 years

The 2011/12 year was an outstanding success for Weston College. Our results were well above national averages with record numbers of 16 to 18 year-old students progressing to further study, higher education, work-based learning or employment.

The curriculum is designed to provide outstanding and inspirational educational opportunities for students. This helps to ensure that, when they progress from Weston College, they are confident, enthusiastic, highly skilled and qualified to enter higher education, further specialist training, apprenticeships, or to move effectively into the workforce.

The learning environment enables all students to realise their full potential whatever their ability or previous attainment. Students are taught by highly-effective and experienced teachers, in the best facilities, using innovative approaches that effectively connect with their academic or vocational expertise. This encourages students to achieve to a higher level than they may have thought possible.

There has been massive growth in recruitment this year with a number of programmes proving very popular, including a growing vehicle maintenance and construction trades curriculum.

Our curriculum 19+ years

Weston College has responded to the significant challenges of Government reform and the associated national, regional and local priorities linked to skills for sustainable growth and the unemployment agenda. Our visionary responses, coupled with our strong partnership work with key stakeholders, is seen as best practice at ministerial level.

We continue to diversify at pace across the curriculum. Despite the challenges of the More for Less Agenda, we continue to witness rapid growth and high levels of success which have led to strong progression into higher education and employment.

Highlights

- Winning a competitive tender for Offender Learning in 13 prisons across the South West.
 A Government investment circa of £10 million per year.
- In partnership with Local Enterprise Partnership, secured £431,573 in renewable technologies to support the re-skilling/up-skilling of adults.
- Over 6,250 adult enrolments compared to 4,176 in 10/11 a 50% increase in a year.
- £7.8 million investment in the adult curriculum during 2010/11, of which £1.5 million supports adult apprenticeships.
- 98% growth in learner numbers on English for Speakers of Other Languages (ESOL) courses.
- Success rates at Level 1, 2 and 3 are well above national benchmarks despite significant growth.
- South West Adult Learner Award 2011/12 goes to Weston College student who progresses to higher education.

- Over 100% growth in apprenticeships.
- Significant growth in the number of people undertaking construction training despite economic downturn.

In partnership with Jobcentre Plus:

- Launch of the Ngage programme for young unemployed adults is highly praised by Government Minister for Department of Work and Pensions "a blue print for 19-24 NEETS" with 100% success.
- Over 300 unemployed adults trained through the innovative 'ASPIRE' programme with positive outcomes well above national average. Another programme noted as highly successful at ministerial level.
- Launch of Work Club in January 2012 has provided informal and valued support for hundreds of job seekers.



Our curriculum - foundation learning

In the last year, we have seen 100% success for our students with learning difficulties/disabilities on foundation learning courses.

Students have benefited from an inclusive approach and specialist support to develop a range of skills and knowledge to help them manage and overcome their learning barriers. With this kind of innovative support, students have been able to progress to supported employment, employment with training, further and higher education courses and independent living.

- Exciting new facilities for foundation learners at 'The Hub' at the South West Skills Campus.
- "Outstanding practice and excellent success rates recognised as exemplary practice", by Ofsted Disability Review 2010.
- National and regional involvement in an 'Enhancement of Learning Support' project with the Learning and Skills Improvement Service (LSIS).
- A new policy report, Ambitious about Autism, was launched in October 2011 at the House of Commons where Weston College featured as an area of outstanding practice in the field of autistic spectrum conditions (ASC).
- Planning underway for the first learners with learning difficulties and/or disabilities (LDD) specialist training facility in North Somerset for people on the autism spectrum.

Our curriculum - higher education

The 2011/12 year has again been a particularly successful one for Weston College's university-level provision.

The Quality Assurance Agency completed their scrutiny of the College's higher education provision and concluded that, not only could it be viewed with confidence and reliance, but also identified the highest number of 'good practice' elements in the South West, and equalling the highest number nationally. In particular, strategic leadership, employer links, quality assurance, staff development, student support and excellent student results were noted.

Also, for the first time, Weston College has successfully bid to the Higher Education Funding Council for England and Wales (Hefce) for directly-funded places from 2012. This indicates further recognition of the College's position as a deliverer of university-level provision, and enables the further development of higher education in the future.

- 600 full-time equivalent students studied higher education programmes an increase of 7% on the previous year.
- 20% of students on honours programmes achieved a first class award compared to 14% nationally for higher education in further education.
- 46% of students on honours programmes achieved an upper second degree (2:1) compared to 27% nationally for higher education in further education.
- Five new programmes developed and validated for 2012, including two honours top-up programmes in Counselling and Public and Environmental Health.





Apprenticeships and training in the workplace

We've seen a phenomenal 1,200 apprentices studying with us in the last year thanks to the focus on apprenticeship growth from our Business Enterprise Centre (BEC).

We are now working with more than 1,000 employers across the country. BEC's strength is its ability to tailor training to employers' needs so that it has a positive impact on their business.

- 77% growth in apprenticeship applications.
- 300% growth in employer work placements.
- More than 20 new apprenticeship job vacancies each month.
- Over 80% of apprentices gain permanent jobs by the time they complete their apprenticeships.
- Specialist apprenticeship recruitment team in place to support employers and apprentices.
- More than 50 different apprenticeships available in all key employment sectors.

- Apprenticeship success rates well above the national benchmarks.
- Strategic partnership developed with Jobcentre Plus to support the unemployed to become 'job ready'.
- Higher level apprenticeships launched in Business
 Administration and Management.
- 260% growth in apprenticeships undertaken in the construction sector.





Capital / revenue investment

The 2011/12 year was an exceptional one for investment in College infrastructure with more building projects and system enhancements delivered than ever before.

- Refurbishment of the Hans Price building to create the Weston College Conference Centre, which opened in January 2012.
- Extension to the Sixth-Form centre to create four additional classrooms.
- Refurbishment of University Campus including new LibraryPlus, Coffee Shop, Student common room and science labs.
- Redecoration and new flooring to every classroom at University Campus.
- Complete refurbishment and new roof to the Performing Arts Centre at Knightstone Campus.
- Creation of the new partnership building at the South West Skills Campus.

- Extension of the open plan office at Knightstone to accommodate the OLASS prison contract HQ staff.
- Creation of additional higher education (HE) classrooms at Knightstone to accommodate the increased number of HE students.
- Refurbishment of the roof at the Knightstone Campus.
- Air conditioning installed in all Knightstone Campus IT rooms.
- Acquisition of a specialist training centre for students with autism.
- Creation of the new Business
 Enterprise Centre at Locking
 Road in Weston-super-Mare.

We generated an operating surplus of around £383k for 2011/12 and remain financially stable while investing in buildings and technology.




